It is important that all such articles that pertain to NHS gagging that I am providing you with are added to the argument for my petition calling for outright ban on confidentiality clauses.

Also, can the public petitions committee ask how many successful Public Interest Disclosures (PIDA) there have been by workers in the Scottish NHS since the inception of the PIDA in 1998? This figure should provide a stark and vivid picture of whether negative events that effect patient care and safety are being brought to the attention of the media and the public or not? This figure will have a strong bearing on my petition.

We cannot begin to cure our NHS unless we know what has been going wrong in it. If such stories of wrong-doing are being 'covered-up' by gagging clauses and compromise agreements and this is being funded by millions of pounds of public money then there is surely a much greater problem that the public are not aware of?
