This session included two presentations. The first presentation discussed the refresh of the Scottish Cancer Referral Guidelines, concluding with a question and answer session. The second presentation discussed updates to the Scottish Bowel Screening Programme, including the introduction of FIT. Again, this concluded with a questions and answer session.

The meeting included a statement from Jeane Freeman MSP, Cabinet Secretary for Health and Sport responding to a previous CPG report analysing the current cancer strategy. This portion concluded with a questions and answer session. The meeting continued with a presentation from the Less Survivable Cancer Taskforce. This session discussed their priorities to improve the rates of survival for the less survivable cancers.

24th September 2019

The session began with our AGM. The remainder of the meeting included a discussion aimed to inform a report that will advise on the CPGs priorities for a future cancer strategy.
