6.1	<p>The meeting received a presentation from Stuart Hay (Director, Living Streets Scotland).</p> <p>Stuart recommended that plans should be made to launch the report, that follow-up should be established as part of the CPG's work programme, and that the CPG should monitor progress.</p> <p>It was agreed that the presentation would be published online.</p> <p>There was discussion on a number of matters, including: whether the responsibility for action lay with The City of Edinburgh Council rather than with the Scottish Parliament; whether contact should be made with the Scottish Government transport minister; and whether the Parliament's chief executive should be advised.</p> <p>It was agreed that a follow-up meeting be held between Stuart &amp; the Convenors to agree an appropriate course of action.</p> <p>It was agreed that members of the CPG interested in assisting Stuart should identify themselves to Colin Howden.</p>	<p><b>ACTION: Colin Howden</b> to publish presentation online.</p> <p><b>ACTION: Stuart Hay</b> to set up follow-up meeting with the CPG Convenors.</p> <p><b>ACTION: Any CPG members</b> to indicate interest to Colin Howden.</p>
