Lewis Macdonald MSP (LM) opened the meeting, provided a safety brief and welcome and then passed the floor to the first speaker, Jeremy Bentham, Vice President Global Business Environment & Head of Scenarios, Royal Dutch Shell, who spoke around the "Shell Scenario, Sky – Meeting the Goals of the Paris Agreement,"

This detailed the uncertainties ahead, challenges for the 21<sup>st</sup> century, development and decarbonisation as well as exploring the electrification, fuels and efficiency and renewables charts in order to try to develop a scenario in which the balance, and goal of the Paris Agreement is achieved.

The floor was then passed to Jo Coleman, UK Energy Transition Manager, who spoke about Shell in the UK, the contribution and upstream activity as well as new fuels and Shell's role as an integrated power player enabling it to drive through the UK's energy transition.

LM then opened the floor up to questions which covered such topics as: collaboration; battery charging points; the Scottish Governments Energy Strategy and Carbon Pricing.

LM then thanked the speakers and brought the session to a close.
