It is estimated that more than 90,000 people in Scotland have dementia, with the number expected to increase considerably as Scotland's population grows older. It is important for there to be a forum for people with dementia, carers and stakeholders across disciplines have a forum to share their expertise and knowledge to inform policy development and decision making.

It is anticipated that the following topics will be discussed during 2017, however, the group will also look for input from members about what would be of greatest value for the group to discuss and will include these for future meetings:

1. Third National Dementia Strategy
2. Palliative Care/End of life (as a joint session with the CPG on Palliative Care)
3. Care Charging
4. Dementia Friends
5. Allied Health Professionals
6. Dementia Research
7. Acute settings
