Kenny MacAskill: The current Judicial Complaints Reviewer, Moi Ali, informed me by letter dated 5 December 2013 that she does not wish to be reappointed when her term of office ends in August 2014. I am grateful to her for all the work that she has carried out in this role. I have asked my officials to begin the recruitment of a new Judicial Complaints Reviewer and this will commence shortly.

Ken Macintosh (Eastwood) (Scottish Labour): To ask the Scottish Government how many fire-related fatalities there have been in residential premises in each year since 1999.

Roseanna Cunningham: The Scottish Government publishes long-term trend data on key fire statistics on an annual basis. The latest figures, containing trend data on the number of fatal casualties in primary fires by location for the financial years 1999-2000 to 2012-13, were published as an additional dataset to the *Fire Statistics Scotland 2012-13* publication (published 8 October 2013). The data provides the number of fire fatalities by building type. Whilst the recording category 'residential premises' does not exist within the Fire and Rescue Service's Incident Recording System, the data reports the number of fatalities which occurred at 'dwelling' and 'other building' fires. These will include fire fatalities at residential premises. Whilst 'dwelling' fires are exclusively residential, 'other building' fires will include some fires at non-residential buildings. As such, it cannot be assumed that all fatalities in 'other building' fires occurred in residential premises.
